
1991

Deafness

Sir, One million British workers are exposed to levels of noise that puts hearing at risk, and noise-induced

hearing loss is a serious, permanent and debilitating condition ("Insurers cry 'foul' over rising claims of industrial deafness", Business, Sept 22). This is entirely preventable, and employers who take note of the Control of Noise at Work Regulations 2005 should have risk assessments on file.

An ENT specialist can also diagnose whether deafness is likely to have been caused by long-term exposure to loud noise. Industrial deafness is not a grey area in the context of insurance fraud. STEVE PERKINS Chief executive officer, British





International Qualifications Scheme


- Award of Successful Course Completion for each module




